

CHAPTER 11 The 1960s : Sharpville

Reg Drew remembers that his father, Roy Drew worked for Anglo American at the time and was instrumental in instigating a fund for the relatives of those killed or injured. He approached many influential people who gave to the fund, but many were too cowardly or afraid of the apartheid government to put their names forward publicly. Roy Drew also said that the figures released by the police of those killed and injured were greatly downplayed.¹ Roy Drew subsequently left South Africa and went to live in the UK
